Both the passive voice and the active voice are grammatically correct, but you can make your writing more direct by replacing the passive voice with the active voice when possible. How to Spot the Passive Voice The main signpost of the passive voice is the presence of a two-part verb consisting of a "to be" verb and a past participle.

When the subject is the agent or doer of the action, the verb is in the active voice.When the subject is the patient, target or undergoer of the action, the verb is said to be in the passive voice.
