The Child Behavior Checklist (CBCL) is a widely used questionnaire to assess behavioral and emotional problems. It is often used as a diagnostic screener, but autism spectrum disorders (ASD) are not included in the CBCL for school-aged children. This study investigated patterns of CBCL scores in 108 children with high-functioning ASD from two independent samples, and 67 IQ- and age-matched ...

Indicate the timeframe of the observation. Another thing to consider when writing down an observation report is timeframe. Observations can run for a day, a month, or more. Deciding the timeframe will vary depending on the focus of your observation and how much data is needed to quantify and understand the results of your observation.
