These standards are set by the NMC (The Nursing and Midwifery Council) and present the professional standards that nurses, midwives and nursing associates must uphold in order to be registered to practise in the UK.

The verbal or implied (for example by a gesture) consent of patients to normally risk-free nursing or midwifery care is a sufficient indication that the consent is valid. As with medical interventions, the consent of patients to more serious and higher risk procedures should be informed, written consent.

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Nurses are often confused as to what their role is when obtaining consent for treatment. In most employment settings, the employer has adopted a policy concerning the nurse's role and when such a policy exists, it should be followed. If questions arise about the policy, seeking information out from resources within the facility, including the nurse manager or the risk manager, is a good idea.
